### **DECISION ON THE PAPERS**

This is an application by Rings Scenic Tours Limited for renewal of an off-licence in respect of premises situated at Buckland Road, RD 2 Matamata known as Green Dragon Shop. The general nature of the business is that of a gift/souvenir shop.

This application was lodged on 14 July 2021 and was advertised in accordance with s.101 of the Act, in the Scene on 20 & 27 July 2021. No objections were received.

The days and hours of operation set out in the application are:

**Monday to Sunday from 8.00 am until 9.00 pm**

These hours are the same as the existing hours of operation and comply with the requirements of the provisional Local Alcohol Policy.

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application. Accordingly the application is determined on the papers.


The applicant, in accordance with s. 212 of the Act, has named three managers with current certificates to manage the sale of alcohol from the premises.

In deciding whether to renew an off-licence the committee must have regard to the matters set out in s.105 and 131 of the Act. These are:

#### **Section 105**

- (a) *the object of this Act:*
- (b) *the suitability of the applicant:*

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- (c) *any relevant local alcohol policy:*
  - (d) *the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:*
  - (e) *the design and layout of any proposed premises:*
  - (f) *whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which goods:*
  - (g) *whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:*
  - (h) *whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law:*
  - (i) *any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made under section 103*

### **Section 131**

- (a) *whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence:*
- (b) *any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made by virtue of section 129:*
- (c) *the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.*

The object of the Act is that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly, and the harm caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

The Inspector has noted that he considers the applicant to be a suitable body to hold an off-licence. He has also noted that in his opinion the amenity and good order of the locality would be unlikely to be increased by more than a minor extent by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

I am satisfied as to those matters to which I must have regard and grant the renewal of the off-licence for a further three years.

The renewal certificate can be issued immediately.

### **Conditions**

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day:
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

**Monday to Sunday from 8.00 am until 9.00 pm**


- (c) The licensee shall take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed;
  - i) All staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act





- ii) Evidence of age documents will be requested from any person appearing to be under the age of 25.
  - iii) A sign shall be prominently displayed inside the premises which identifies the name of the manager on duty or the person responsible for the management of the sale and supply of alcohol under the licence
  - iv) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons.
- (d) The licensee shall ensure that when alcohol is being provided free, as a sample drinking water will be made available, free of charge.
- (e) The whole of the premises is undesignated
- (f) The holder of the Manager's Certificate shall be on duty and on site at all times when alcohol is sold. If a duty manager is not present then there shall be no sales and a notice displayed advertising the public of this.
- (g) Managers register (as required by s.232 of the act) is to be maintained and available onsite.
- (h) Only boutique beer made especially for Hobbiton can be sold.
