DECISION ON THE PAPERS

The applicant was recently issued an OFF licence for a new supermarket at Te Poi. The supermarket is due opened 11 December 2020. The applicant has changed the company name since the original application was received. There are no other changes; therefore, a Temporary Licence is required.

The applicant is the owner of the business. There is are two directors of Te Poi Enterprises Limited. Harmandeep Singh and Kulwinder Singh. Therefore for all intents and purposes they are the owners of the premises.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard and we grant the applicant a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under the existing licence.

Section 136(4) of the Act requires the Committee, on making an order, to impose any conditions that the Act requires an on or off-licence to be issued subject to, may impose any conditions that the Act enables the licence to be issued subject to and may impose any other reasonable conditions it thinks fit. Sections 112, 116 and 117 of the Act detail compulsory and discretionary conditions of the licence in force.

The temporary authority is subject to the following conditions in addition to the existing conditions of the licence in force:

a) It is a condition of this Temporary Authority that the holder must comply with all the conditions of the current off-licence, and the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

- b) That an application for an off-licence be made within two months of the date of issue.
- The temporary authority must be displayed next to the base licence attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrance.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.136(5) of the Act which states that the person authorised by this order has the same duties, obligations, and liabilities, as the holder of the underlying on-licence concerned.

The certificate can be issued immediately.
