### DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application for a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under an existing On-licence with an expiry date of 31 October 2022.

The applicant recently purchased Horse and Jockey, the applicant took over the premises on the 17 May 2021.

The applicant is currently trading on a temporary licence, which expires on the 13 August 2021. This is the second application for a temporary authority; it was received on the 6 August 2021. There are no other changes;

The applicant has submitted a substantive application, they realise it will not be processed before the current Temporary Authority expires, hence the reason for the third application for a Temporary Authority.

The MOH have not yet reported on the substantive application, this unfortunately placed the applicant in the position of requiring the second Temporary Licence.

No matters in opposition to this temporary authority have been raised by the Inspector or by the Police.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard and we grant the applicant a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under the existing licence.

Section 136(4) of the Act requires the Committee, on making an order, to impose any conditions that the Act requires an on or off-licence to be issued subject to, may impose any conditions that the Act enables the licence to be issued subject to and may impose any other reasonable conditions it thinks fit. Sections 112, 116 and 117 of the Act detail compulsory and discretionary conditions of the licence in force.

The temporary authority is subject to the following conditions in addition to the existing conditions of the licence in force:

- a) It is a condition of this Temporary Authority that the holder must comply with all the conditions of the current on-licence, and the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- b) That an application for an on-licence be made within two months of the date of issue.
- c) The temporary authority must be displayed next to the base licence attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrance.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.136(5) of the Act which states that the person authorised by this order has the same duties, obligations, and liabilities, as the holder of the underlying on-licence concerned.

The certificate can be issued immediately.
