We're proposing a number of initiatives to reduce waste to protect our beautiful district for future generations - and we want to know what you think of our proposals. - **Donna Quinn** So what will our rates portion of rubbish cover now you want us to pay for bags and do you think this was thought of before you put our rates up could you clarify this (3 likes)
 - Matamata-Piako District Council Hi Donna the rubbish and recycling portion of your rates will drop significantly from \$153 to around \$30, which will go towards the costs of the kerbside collection contract (along with the income we receive from rubbish bags). This means if you only buy 52 rubbish bags (the same number you



were previously allocated), you will be paying less overall for rubbish and recycling services (i.e. your targeted rate for solid waste will drop by \$123, and 52 bags will only cost \$104). (3 likes)

- o Donna Quinn Matamata-Piako District Council thanks for responding(3 likes)
- MikeeCez Cameron-Walker the rubbish and recycling portion of rates would, in theory (and theory only), drop for home owners. For lower socio-economic renters, this will present yet another added cost in addition to what is already being paid. (Unless we're buying into delusions of such supposed rate drops being passed on via rent drops?)
- **Matamata-Piako District Council** You're right MikeeCez Cameron-Walker that this change will affect renters the most significantly. We're encouraging landlords and tenants to start talking about this now to determine who will be responsible for rubbish bags from 1 July.
- **MikeeCez Cameron-Walker** Let's be real it's going to be left to renters to deal with and pick up the cost.
- **Nick Harding** Not really, it has an effect on us all, I'm looking at my rates for next year and our uniform annual general charge is going up so is water in fact our rates have inflated so that we have to pay more with the reduction in place...
- **Lynette Hansford** Matamata-Piako District Council the solid waste portion of our rates is going down, yes. But the other parts are going up (according to the proposed rates on your website). So the overall rates total increases and then you still have to add in the cost of rubbish bags!
- Maxine Schultz Think the charged for the Rubbish bags are two dear. For any of us Low income
 - **Matamata-Piako District Council** Good news then Maxine from 1 July the price for rubbish bags will drop to \$2 each :-)
 - **Maxine Schultz** That is still too dear. Would like them to be about 50 cents .Sell in a bundle for about \$3.00 .Like the Super markets one are .You get 30 in a bags .For so many weeks.

- Chris Applebee How can I reduce my waste when manufacturers continue to put excess packaging on their goods? Councils and central government should be putting pressure on manufacturers to limit the "showy" packaging rather than expecting the onus to be solely on the consumer/ratepayer (8 likes)
 - Christine Whelan Couldn't agree with you more Chris! So tired of struggling to get through layers and layers of plastic and card packaging that I then have to dispose of
 - and that add absolutely nothing to the value of the purchase! (2 likes)





- Chris Applebee One of my pet hates. So much unnecessary packaging in most cases yet councils still try to force us to reduce our waste. I am not the one generating the waste. I am just the one that has to get rid of it because I can't buy goods without packaging. (3 likes)

- **Karen Remetis** That packaging costs..us. as we remove itcand biff it in the bin weve paid for that packaging to be put on the object of purchase. Maybe we should say "how much without the packaging?" (2 likes)
- **Chantelle Hay** I dont know if i am being dumb but people that dont own houses that rent that will not be getting bags anymore if they cant afford it what stops thrm fro. Just getting cheap black bags from shop. I dont see how it will make it better. (1 like)
 - MikeeCez Cameron-Walker Becomes OBP. Hands thusly washed.
 From what I've seen in other instances of such schemes, it will only be the "official" bags that will be accepted, or buy your own bags (size limits) and pop a sticker on it. The bigger problem is that renters will be at a significant disadvantage under this sort of scheme. It is extremely unlikely renters will benefit from any supposed rate cut such a scheme is suggested to bring. Instead they will be lumbered with an extra household expense, for many one they can ill afford.
- Shelley Tesselaar More black sacks will be purchased and more rubbish dumped on our roadsides......awesome. Zero waste is ridiculous, minimal waste is where we should be heading (2 likes)
 - **Beverley Brownlee** just get a wheely bin shelly, cheaper and they dont give a fuck what goes in there. And lucklily Higgins contractors did a great job when cleaning up the main road last time. (1 like)
 - **Kimbo Kim** Alot of people cant afford wheelies though. So probly look forward to them 52 free bags. (1 like)
- Jan Shoemark Why don't counsellors have sessions in the smaller towns. It seems Watio, Waihou and Tahuna all have halls and even though Waitoa hall has been decommissioned its still used by fonterra so therefore useable for counsellors.
- MikeeCez Cameron-Walker A "zero waste" initiative is, to put it plainly, idiotic.
- Scrap that nonsense, get a new think-tank, and work on waste minimalisation instead. (1 like)
- Jan Shoemark My concern on charging for rubbish bags will be the poor that struggle and will this increase in more illegal dumping which can cause more problems to clean up? (1 like)
 - **MikeeCez Cameron-Walker** Yup, exactly. This has very little to do with actually waste management, much more to do with making the financial bottom line look better in relation to such. Making it harder for people to dispose of rubbish does not magically make that rubbish go away.
- **MikeeCez Cameron-Walker** Ah. So, from having a brief squizz at the proposal, it seems it's already been decided and put into action that we'll now be paying for rubbish bags AND transfer station fees have gone up.





Looks like renters who are already struggling to cope with significant hikes in rates and living costs can't dodge the revenue bullet. So what's it to be then? The much maligned dump'n'run? Or backyard fire pit time? (1 like)
