Matamata-Piako Memorials





All monuments/memorials must be approved by Council and a permit issued prior to installation.

Installation work in all cemeteries shall be carried out to the satisfaction of Council. Applications must be completed using the approved council form.

The family or representatives are responsible for providing, installing and maintaining the monument. Council may remove any installations that may fall into a state of disrepair.

If at any time the family or representatives wish to remove or replace the installation, they must obtain written permission from Council prior to removal.

No monuments other than approved headstones are to be installed within the cemetery.

No trees, shrubs or flowers shall be planted in any part of any cemetery without the consent of Council first being obtained. Any memorial must comply with the requirements of Council – see the dimensions table over the page.

Monumental Masons complete the installation of plaques and headstones and other monuments within our Cemeteries. This is to ensure a consistent standard of installation and minimises the risk of poorly erected installations toppling, being subjected to vandalism and unauthorised removal.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the cost of a headstone?

The cost varies. You will need to contact a council approved monumental mason for a price.

Can we have a headstone that is placed across plots?

Yes, if you own the plots. If the monument crosses over a reserve (unoccupied) plot/s the reserve plot/s will not be able to be sold back to Council.

Can you purchase a plot, put a headstone on it and have it as a memorial only?

Yes, but you need to provide Council with the deceased details. An 'Application to Inter' form will also need to be completed (it will be noted that it is to be a memorial only).

How do I arrange for a memorial for an RSA plot?

Can I put a vase on the berm of the plot?

Yes, a hole for a vase is placed in the berm in most cemeteries. Council staff can confirm if this is available.

How do I get a vase for an ashes wall plot?

Vases must be bronze and can be purchased locally. Contact one of Council's offices for more details.
