



We are starting to review the planning rules for Papakāinga and need your input. Papakāinga is a collective and traditional form of Māori living, it translates to "a nurturing place to return to".

Development of papakāinga would unlock ancestral land – creating opportunities for whanau to return and connect. It would also provide opportunities for tamariki to live on ancestral land – closer to their grandparents, aunts and uncles, developing a deeper connection with ancestors laid to rest on the papakāinga.
