DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by the Matamata Clay Target Club Incorporated for renewal of their club licence in respect of a premises situated at 220B Tauranga Road, Matamata known as the Matamata Gun Club. The general nature of the premises is that of a sports club.

The premises that the renewal applies to is a building owned by the Gun Club which is adjacent to the Clubs clay target traps. The Gun Club has entered into an arrangement with the Matamata Fishing Club to share the building and therefore Fishing Club members form part of the Gun Club membership.

The applicant has noted that the bar will not be open when shooting is taking place on the traps.

This application was lodged on the 18th November 2014, with notification carried out in the Matamata Chronicle on 12th and 19th November 2014. No objections were received.

The days on which and the hours during which alcohol is to be sold was not set out in the usual manner in the public notice. The notice listed the days but only indicated that the hours for each club would be 25 hours/month. After discussion between the Inspector and the Club, the Club has agreed to continue with their current hours:



Wednesday to Friday Saturday and Sunday 5.00pm until 10.00pm 12 midday until 10.00pm.

These hours comply with the requirements of the Council's Provisional Local Alcohol Policy as it applies to this type of premises.

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application. The NZ Fire Service have advised that they would not object to the renewal of the licence. Accordingly the application is determined on the papers.

The applicant, in accordance with s.212 of the Act, has named a manager with a current certificate to manage the sale of alcohol from the premises.

In deciding whether to renew a licence the committee must have ard to the matters set out in s.105 and 131 of the Act. These are:

Section 105

- (a) the object of this Act:
- (b) the suitability of the applicant:
- (c) any relevant local alcohol policy:
- (d) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:
- (e) the design and layout of any proposed premises:
- (f) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which goods:
- (g) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes on the premises to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:
- (j) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law:
- (k) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made under section 103

Section 131

- (b) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence:
- (c) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made by virtue of section 129:
- (d) the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol.

The object of the Act is that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly, and the harm caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

In C.

The Inspector has noted that he considers The Matamata Clay Target Club to be a suitable body to hold a club licence. He has also noted that in his opinion the amenity and good order of the locality would be unlikely to be increased by more than a minor extent by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence.

I am satisfied as to those matters to which I must have regard and grant the renewal of the club licence for a further three years.

When renewing a licence, s.132 allows the District Licensing Committee to impose conditions as set out in s.116 or to vary or cancel any conditions applying to the licence before its renewal. I have varied the conditions to more closely align with the objectives of the new Act and the club licence is now subject to these conditions.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.259 of the Act which makes it an offence to not comply with certain requirements and restrictions imposed by or under this Act, specifically sections 46 to 63 as they may apply to this licence and s.231(1). A copy of these sections is attached for the applicant's information.

The renewal certificate can be issued immediately.

The licence is subject to the following conditions:

a) Alcohol may only be sold under the licence on the following days and during the following hours:

Wednesday to Friday 5.00pm until 10.00pm Saturday and Sunday 12 midday until 10.00pm.

- b) A certified manager shall be responsible for the sale and supply of alcohol under this licence.
- c) No alcohol is to be sold or supplied when the shooting range is operational.
- d) The Club shall take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises are observed:
 - i) All bar personnel will be trained in their responsibilities under the Act.
 - ii) Evidence of age documents will be requested from any person appearing to be under the age of 25.
 - iii) A sign shall be prominently displayed inside the premises which identifies the name of the manager on duty or the person responsible for the management of the sale and supply of alcohol under the licence.
- e) The Club shall have a reasonable range of food available for consumption on the premises at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence. The food shall be of the range and types of food submitted with the application but must be no less substantial than snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizza or the like. The availability of these foodstuffs shall be notified to patrons by appropriate notices throughout the premises.
- f) The Club must ensure that drinking water will be made readily available to all attendees, free of charge.
- g) The following steps shall be taken by the Club to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

- Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the sale of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition of sales to intoxicated persons, and
- ii) Photo identification is required to be produced by the customer when staff are in doubt of their age.
