DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by The Te Aroha Angling Club Incorporation for a special licence in respect of a premises situated at 44 Stanley Avenue, Te Aroha known as the A R Johns Hall at Boyd Park.

The application is made under section 137 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and is to allow for the sale and supply of alcohol to attendees of a function on an otherwise unlicensed premises. The day and hours sought for the licence are:

Fishing Tournament Weigh In and Prize Giving Sunday 1 December 2019 from 3.00 pm until 8.00 pm

This event is considered to be consistent with the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 and the Matamata-Piako District Council's Provisional Local Alcohol Policy and its current Liquor Licensing Policy.

The application was referred to the Police, Medical Officer of Health and Inspector for comment. No matters in opposition have been raised in respect of the application. Accordingly the application is determined on the papers.

In deciding whether to issue a special licence a committee must have regard to the matters set out in s.142 of the Act. These are:

- a) the object of this Act:
- b) the nature of the particular event for which the licence is sought
- c) the suitability of the applicant:
- d) any relevant local alcohol policy:

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- e) whether the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence:
- f) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to TAMATA-I sell alcohol:
- g) the design and layout of the premises concerned:
- h) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law:
- i) any areas of the premises that the applicant proposes should be designated as restricted areas or supervised areas:
- j) any steps the applicant proposes to take to ensure that the requirements of this Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
- k) the applicant's proposals relating to the sale and supply of low alcoholic, and non-alcoholic drinks, the provision of food and information about alternative forms of transport from the premises:
- I) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health, or an Inspector.

The object of the Act is that the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly, and the harm caused by excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

The Inspector has noted that he considers the applicant, The Te Aroha Angling Club Incorporated, to be a suitable body to hold a special licence. He has also noted that in his opinion the sale and supply of alcohol at this event will not reduce the amenity and good order of the locality by more than a minor extent.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and I grant the applicant a special licence.

A certificated manager has been identified by the applicant to manage the sale and supply of alcohol at this event.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions.

a) Alcohol may only be sold under this licence on the following day and hours:

Fishing Tournament Weigh In and Prize Giving Sunday 1 December 2019 from 3.00 pm until 8.00 pm

- b) A manager, holding a current Manager's Certificate issued pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 shall be responsible for the sale of alcohol during these events.
- c) The licensee shall have a reasonable range of food available for consumption on the premises at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence. The food shall be of the range and types of food submitted with the application but must be no less substantial than snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizza or the like. The availability of these foodstuffs shall be notified to patrons by regular public address announcements made during the course of the tournament.



- d) The licensee shall have a reasonable range of low alcohol and non-alcoholic refreshments available for consumption on the premises at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence.
- e) The licensee shall ensure that drinking water will be made readily available to all attendees, free of charge.
- f) The licensed area, as shown on the plan submitted with the application (date stamped 10 September 2019) must be displayed with the licence and be clearly delinated.
- g) All alcohol supplied from the licenced area must be consumed within the licenced area.
- h) The following steps shall be taken by the licensee to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - i) The person responsible for the sale of alcohol shall ensure that alcohol is not sold or provided to minors or to intoxicated persons.
 - ii) Photo identification is required to be produced by the customer when staff are in doubt of their age.
