DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application for a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under an existing on-licence in respect of a premises situated at 54 Broadway, Matamata known as Indus Valley Restaurant & Cafe. The premises is a restaurant and has a current on-licence with an expiry date of 29 November 2019.

The reason for the temporary authority is due to the business changing ownership. The takeover date was 15 July 2019.

Craft Group Limited has two directors. Ramandeep Bajwa is the director of the Indian Affair Restaurant and Bar at Taupo. Ramandeep has operated that Restaurant for two and a half years. Amritpal Singh is a Sales Manager at Selmet Power. Details of managers are detailed in the inspectors report.

No matters in opposition to this temporary authority have been raised by the Inspector or by the Police.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard and we grant the applicant a temporary authority to carry on the sale and supply of alcohol under the existing licence.

Section 136(4) of the Act requires the Committee, on making an order, to impose any conditions that the Act requires an on or off-licence to be issued subject to, may impose any conditions that the Act enables the licence to be issued subject to and may impose any other reasonable conditions it thinks fit. Sections 112, 116 and 117 of the Act detail compulsory and discretionary conditions of the licence in force.


The temporary authority is subject to the following conditions in addition to the existing conditions of the licence in force:

- a) It is a condition of this Temporary Authority that the holder must comply with all the conditions of the current on-licence, and the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- b) That an application for an on-licence be made within two months of the date of issue.
- c) The temporary authority must be displayed next to the base licence attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through the principal entrance.
- d) The holder of a managers certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is sold. If a duty manager is not present, then there shall be no alcohol sales and a notice displayed advising the public of this fact.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.136(5) of the Act which states that the person authorised by this order has the same duties, obligations, and liabilities, as the holder of the underlying on-licence concerned.

The certificate can be issued immediately.
